
„The Agreement between the telecommunications administrations of Austria, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Hungary, the Slovak Republic and Slovenia concerning the allotment of preferential frequencies and the coordination of systems using DCS 1800 standards in the frequency bands 1710-1785 MHz and 1805-1880 MHz”  
Vienna, September 30<sup>th</sup> 1994”
